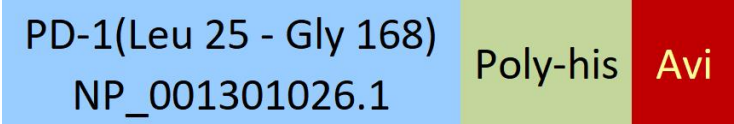

Biotinylated Canine PD-1, His,Avitag(PD1-C52E5) is expressed from human 293 cells (HEK293). It contains AA Leu 25 - Gly 168 (Accession # [NP_001301026.1](#)).

Predicted N-terminus: Leu 25

Molecular Characterization



This protein carries a polyhistidine tag at the C-terminus, followed by an Avi tag (Avitag™).

The protein has a calculated MW of 19.7 kDa. The protein migrates as 32-36 kDa under reducing (R) condition (SDS-PAGE) due to glycosylation.

Labeling

Biotinylation of this product is performed using Avitag™ technology. Briefly, the single lysine residue in the Avitag is enzymatically labeled with biotin.

Protein Ratio

Passed as determined by the HABA assay / binding ELISA.

Purity

>90% as determined by SDS-PAGE.

Formulation

Lyophilized from 0.22 µm filtered solution in PBS, pH7.4 with trehalose as protectant.

Storage

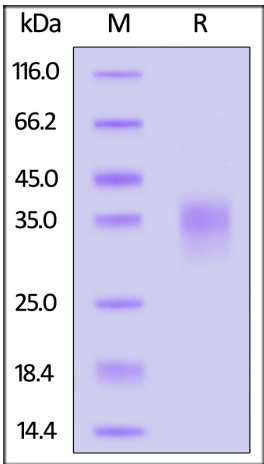
For long term storage, the product should be stored at lyophilized state at -20°C or lower.

Please avoid repeated freeze-thaw cycles.

This product is stable after storage at:

- 20°C to -70°C for 12 months in lyophilized state;
- 70°C for 3 months under sterile conditions after reconstitution.

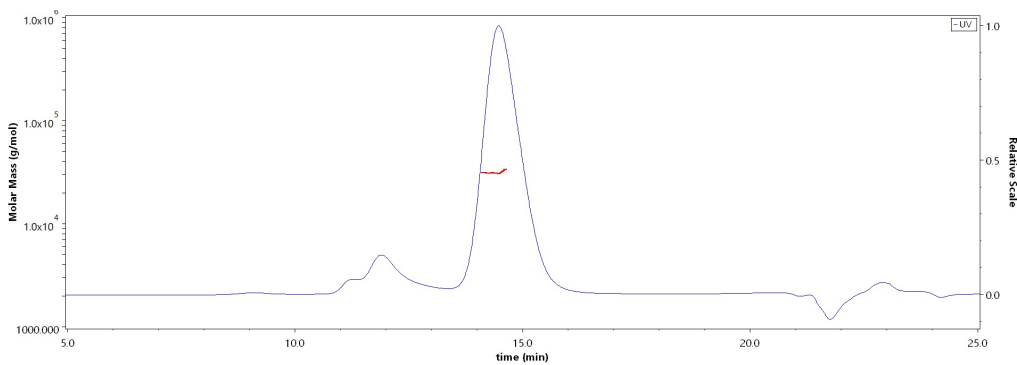
SDS-PAGE

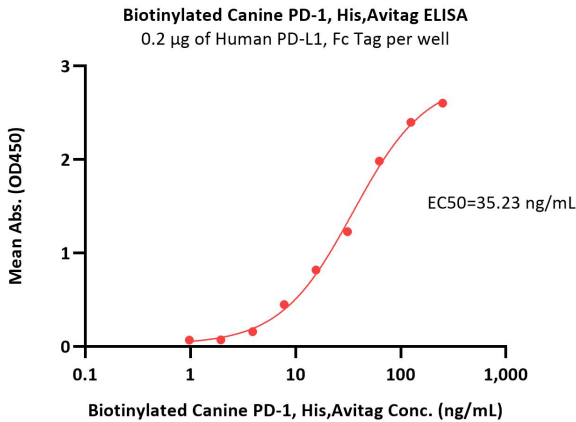


The purity of Biotinylated Canine PD-1, His,Avitag (Cat. No. PD1-C52E5) is more than 85% and the molecular weight of this protein is around 27-40 kDa verified by SEC-MALS.

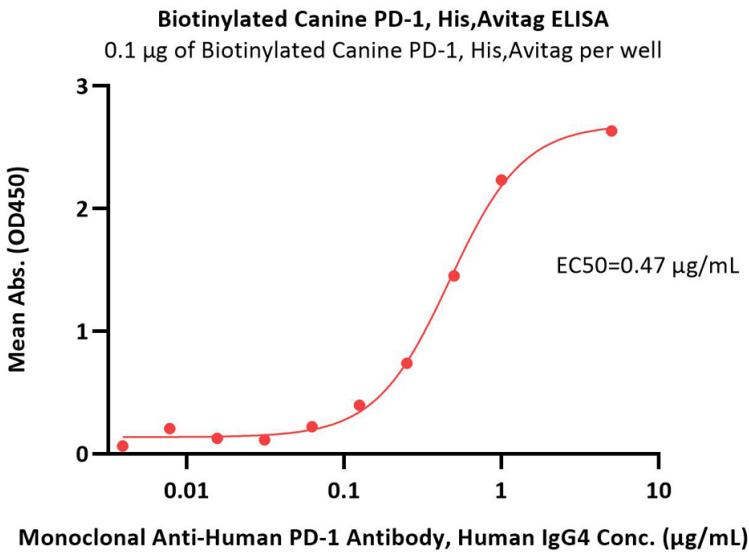
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Immobilized Human PD-L1, Fc Tag (Cat. No. PD1-H5258) at 2 µg/mL (100 µL/well) can bind Biotinylated Canine PD-1, His,Avitag (Cat. No. PD1-C52E5) with a linear range of 1-63 ng/mL (QC tested).



Immobilized Biotinylated Canine PD-1, His,Avitag (Cat. No. PD1-C52E5) at 1 µg/mL (100 µL/well) on streptavidin (Cat. No. STN-N5116) precoated (0.5 µg/well) plate can bind Monoclonal Anti-Human PD-1 Antibody, Human IgG4 with a linear range of 0.004-1 µg/mL (Routinely tested).

Background

Programmed cell death protein 1 (PD-1) is also known as CD279 and PDCD1, is a type I membrane protein and is a member of the extended CD28/CTLA-4 family of T cell regulators. PDCD1 is expressed on the surface of activated T cells, B cells, macrophages, myeloid cells and a subset of thymocytes. PD-1 has two ligands, PD-L1 and PD-L2, which are members of the B7 family. PD-L1 is expressed on almost all murine tumor cell lines, including PA1 myeloma, P815 mastocytoma, and B16 melanoma upon treatment with IFN-γ. PD-L2 expression is more restricted and is expressed mainly by DCs and a few tumor lines. PD1 inhibits the T-cell proliferation and production of related cytokines including IL-1, IL-4, IL-10 and IFN-γ by suppressing the activation and transduction of PI3K/AKT pathway. In addition, coligation of PD1 inhibits BCR-mediating signal by dephosphorylating key signal transducer. In vitro, treatment of anti-CD3 stimulated T cells with PD-L1-Ig results in reduced T cell proliferation and IFN-γ secretion. Monoclonal antibodies targeting PD-1 that boost the immune system are being developed for the treatment of cancer.
