Human VSIG8, Fc Tag(VS8-H5250) is expressed from human 293 cells (HEK293). It contains AA Val 22 - Gly 263 (Accession # NP 001013683.1). Predicted N-terminus: Val 22

Molecular Characterization

VSIG8(Val 22 - Gly 263) Fc(Pro 100 - Lys 330) P01857 NP_001013683.1

This protein carries a human IgG1 Fc tag at the C-terminus.

The protein has a calculated MW of 53.7 kDa. The protein migrates as 55-65 kDa under reducing (R) condition, and 110-130 kDa under non-reducing (NR) condition (SDS-PAGE) due to glycosylation.

Endotoxin

Less than 1.0 EU per μ g by the LAL method / rFC method.

Purity

>95% as determined by SDS-PAGE.

Formulation

Lyophilized from 0.22 µm filtered solution in

Tris with Glycine, Arginine and NaCl, pH7.5 with trehalose as protectant.

Storage


For long term storage, the product should be stored at lyophilized state at -20°C or lower.

Please avoid repeated freeze-thaw cycles.

This product is stable after storage at:

- -20°C to -70°C for 12 months in lyophilized state;
- -70°C for 3 months under sterile conditions after reconstitution.

SDS-PAGE



Human VSIG8, Fc Tag on SDS-PAGE under reducing (R) and non-reducing (NR) conditions. The gel was stained with Coomassie Blue. The purity of the protein is greater than 95%.

Background

V-set and immunoglobulin domain containing 8 (VSIG8), also known as C1orf204, is a type I transmembrane protein of the B7 family within the Ig superfamily. VSIG8 was identified from proteomic analysis of human hair shafts. It is expressed in the hair follicle and shaft, superficial layers of the nail matrix, and superficial layers of oral epithelium.
