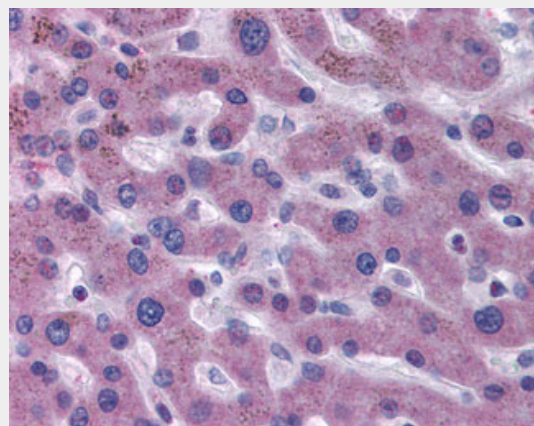

Factor VIIa will also convert factor IX to factor IXa in the presence of tissue factor and calcium.
