Background

Canakinumab is a recombinant human monoclonal antibody which binds to IL-1 β (interleukin-1 beta). It's mode of action is based on the neutralization of IL-1 β signaling, resulting in suppression of inflammation in patients with disorders of autoimmune origin. In June 2009, the FDA approved canakinumab for the treatment of cryopyrin-associated periodic syndromes (CAPS), a spectrum of autoinflammatory syndromes. In September 2016, the FDA approved it's use for three additional rare and serious auto-inflammatory diseases: tumor necrosis factor receptor associated periodic syndrome (TRAPS), hyperimmunoglobulin D syndrome (HIDS)/mevalonate kinase deficiency (MKD), and familial Mediterranean fever (FMF). In June 2020, canakinumab was FDA-approved for the indication to treat active Still's disease, including adult-onset Still's disease (AOSD).

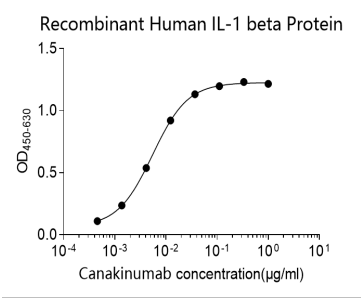
Purification

Protein A or G purification

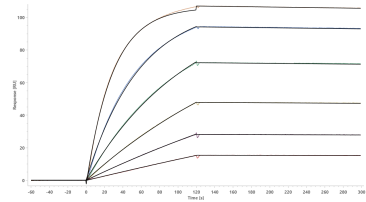
Storage

Direct ELISA binding curve demonstrating the recognition of Human Anti-Human IL-1 β (Research Grade Canakinumab Biosimilar) Monoclonal Antibody to IL-1 β . The target protein was coated onto the microplate well surface, followed by binding of the antibody. A donkey anti-human IgG HRP conjugate was used for detection.



Human IL-1 β SPR assay. Determined through SPR assay, the Human Anti-Human IL-1 β (Research Grade Canakinumab Biosimilar) Monoclonal Antibody is capable of binding to Human IL-1 β with an affinity constant of 0.1067 nM.
