**Description:** The monoclonal antibody recognizes human Interleukin 13 receptor alpha 1 (IL-13Ra1),

a subunit of the IL-13 receptor. This subunit forms a receptor complex with IL-4 receptor alpha, a subunit shared by IL-13 and IL-4 receptors. This subunit serves as a primary IL +13-binding subunit of the IL-13 receptor, and may also be a component of IL-4

receptors. This protein has been shown to bind tyrosine kinase TYK2, and thus may mediate the signaling processes that lead to the activation of JAK1, STAT3 and STAT6

induced by IL13 and IL4.

**Formulation:** Lyophilized in PBS with 1% BSA and 0.1% sodium azide. Precaution: Sodium azide is a

poisonous and hazardous substance which should be handled by trained staff only.

Purification: Ion exchange chromatography

Reconstitution: Centrifuge vial prior to opening. Add 1 ml sterile distilled water to the vial to fully

solubilize the antibody.

**Applications:** Immunohistochemistry, Functional Studies. Not suitable for flow cytometry.

**Application Notes:** IHC on methanol fixed cells and paraffin embedded sections. The optimal concentration

should be determined by the user for each specific application.

**Storage & Stability:** Reconstituted antibody is stable for 6 months at 2-8°C. For longer storage, freeze in

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working aliquots at -20°C to -80°C. Avoid repeated freeze-thaw cycles.

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
