**Description:** HSPB8 displays temperature-dependent chaperone activity. HSPB8 acts as a mn(2+)-

dependent serine-threonine- specific protein kinase. we are not convinced that this is its true role. Defects in HSPB8 are a cause of distal hereditary motor neuropathy type ii (DHMN2) also known as distal spinal muscular atrophy (DSMA) and spinal muscular atrophy of the Charcot-Marie-Tooth type. it is an autosomal dominant disorder of lower

motor neurons characterized by distal muscle weakness.

Formulation: The HSPB8 protein was lyophilized from a concentrated (1 mg/ml) solution containing 20

mM Tris-acetate, pH-7.6 + 10 mM NaCl + 0.1 mM EDTA + 0.1 mM PMSF + 15 mM b-

ME.

**Purity:** Greater than 95.0% as determined by SDS-PAGE.

Immunological Activity: Immunoreactivity is confirmed by reaction with monoclonal mouse antibodies against

HSPB8.

**Physical Appearance:** Sterile Filtered White lyophilized (freeze-dried) powder.

Solubility: It is recommended to reconstitute the lyophilized HSPB8 in sterile 18 MΩ-cm H<sub>2</sub>O not

less than 100µg/ml, which can then be further diluted to other aqueous solutions.

Storage & Stability: Lyophilized HSPB8 although stable at room temperature for 3 weeks, should be stored

desiccated below -18°C. Upon reconstitution HSPB8 should be stored at 4°C between 2 -7 days and for future use below -18°C. For long term storage it is recommended to add
