Description: CXC chemokine receptors are integral membrane proteins, specifically GPCRs, that

specifically bind and respond to cytokines of the CXC chemokine family. CXCR3 ligands include CXCL9/Mig (monokine induced by interferon-g), CXCL10/IP10 (interferon-g-

inducible 10 kDa protein) and CXCL11/I-TAC (interferon-inducible T cell a-

chemoattractant). CXCR3 engagement induces cellular responses that are involved in leukocyte traffic, most notably integrin activation, cytoskeletal changes and chemotactic

migration.

The receptor is available in the following formats: stable over-expression cell line,

membrane preparation, or purified receptor in HEK293 or CHO. Various tagged versions

are available.


