Product Overview	Recombinant Rat UCHL1 (Q00981) (Glu 2-Ala 223) was expressed in E. coli, fused with a polyhistidine tag at the N-terminus.

Form	Lyophilized from sterile PBS, pH 7.4. Normally 5 % - 8 % trehalose, mannitol and 0.01% Tween80 are added as protectants before lyophilization.
Bio-activity	Measured by the hydrolysis of UbiquitinAMC. The specific activity is >100 pmoles/min/μg.
Molecular Mass	The recombinant Rat UCHL1 comprises 233 amino acids and predicts a molecular mass of 26.2 kDa. The apparent molecular mass of the Rat UCHL1 is approximately 28 kDa in SDS-PAGE under reducing conditions.
Purity	> 97 % as determined by SDS-PAGE
Storage	Samples are stable for up to twelve months from date of receipt at -20°C to -80°C. Store

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it under sterile conditions at -20°C to -80°C. It is recommended that the protein be aliquoted for optimal storage. Avoid repeated freeze-thaw cycles.

Reconstitution

It is recommended that sterile water be added to the vial to prepare a stock solution of 0.2 ug/ul. Centrifuge the vial at 4°C before opening to recover the entire contents.
