Description:

Human Interleukin 19 (IL-19) is a member of the IL-10 family of related cytokines. IL-19 expression has been observed in keratinocytes and monocytes. IL-19 binds a receptor complex consisting of IL-20R alpha and the IL-20 R beta. This receptor complex is also shared by IL-20 and IL-24.

Species: Human

Biological Activity: Fully biologically active when compared to standard. The ED₅₀ as determined by a cell proliferation assay using human IL-20R α and human IL-20R β co-transfected murine BaF3 pro-B cells is less than 1.5 ng/ml, corresponding to a specific activity of > 6.7 × 10⁵ IU/mg.

Molecular Weight: Approximately 17.9 kDa, a single non-glycosylated polypeptide chain containing 153 amino acids.

Formulation: Lyophilized from a 0.2 µm filtered concentrated solution in PBS, pH 7.4.

Appearance: Sterile Filtered White lyophilized (freeze-dried) powder.

Reconstitution: We recommend that this vial be briefly centrifuged prior to opening to bring the contents to the bottom. Reconstitute in sterile distilled water or aqueous buffer containing 0.1 % BSA to a concentration of 0.1-1.0 mg/mL. Stock solutions should be apportioned into working aliquots and stored at \leq -20 °C. Further dilutions should be made in appropriate buffered solutions.

Purity: > 95 % by SDS-PAGE and HPLC analyses.

Endotoxin Level: Less than 1 EU/ μ g of rHulL-19 as determined by LAL method.

Storage: This lyophilized preparation is stable at 2-8 °C, but should be kept at -20 °C for long term storage, preferably desiccated. Upon reconstitution, the preparation is stable for up to one week at 2-8 °C. For maximal stability, apportion the reconstituted preparation into working aliquots and store at -20 °C to -70 °C. Avoid repeated freeze/thaw cycles.

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
