chromatography using epitope-specific immunogen.

**Function** Thrombin inhibitor activated by the glycosaminoglycans, heparin or dermatan

> sulfate. In the presence of the latter, HC-II becomes the predominant thrombin inhibitor in place of antithrombin III (AT-III). Also inhibits chymotrypsin, but in a glycosaminoglycan-independent manner. Peptides at the N-terminal of HC-II have chemotactic activity for both monocytes and neutrophils.

The N-terminal acidic repeat region mediates, in part, the glycosaminoglycan-**Sequence and Domain Family** 

accelerated thrombin inhibition.
